Our main current project is providing gift copies of the Microsoft Store edition of the metric version of the EHV Lutheran Study Bible to teachers in our worker training system around the world and setting up good market outlets for this Bible in Africa and Asia. This is more difficult than we expected because the Microsoft Store does not allow copies to be sent from the United States to other regions of the world. Microsoft apps must be downloaded from the Microsoft Store in that region of the world in which the recipients live, so we are trying to figure out the rules of the game and how to get the copies to recipients. We are working to set up good sites for distributing this Bible in Africa and Asia and have been in contact with African and Asian Bible Societies and mission groups about this.

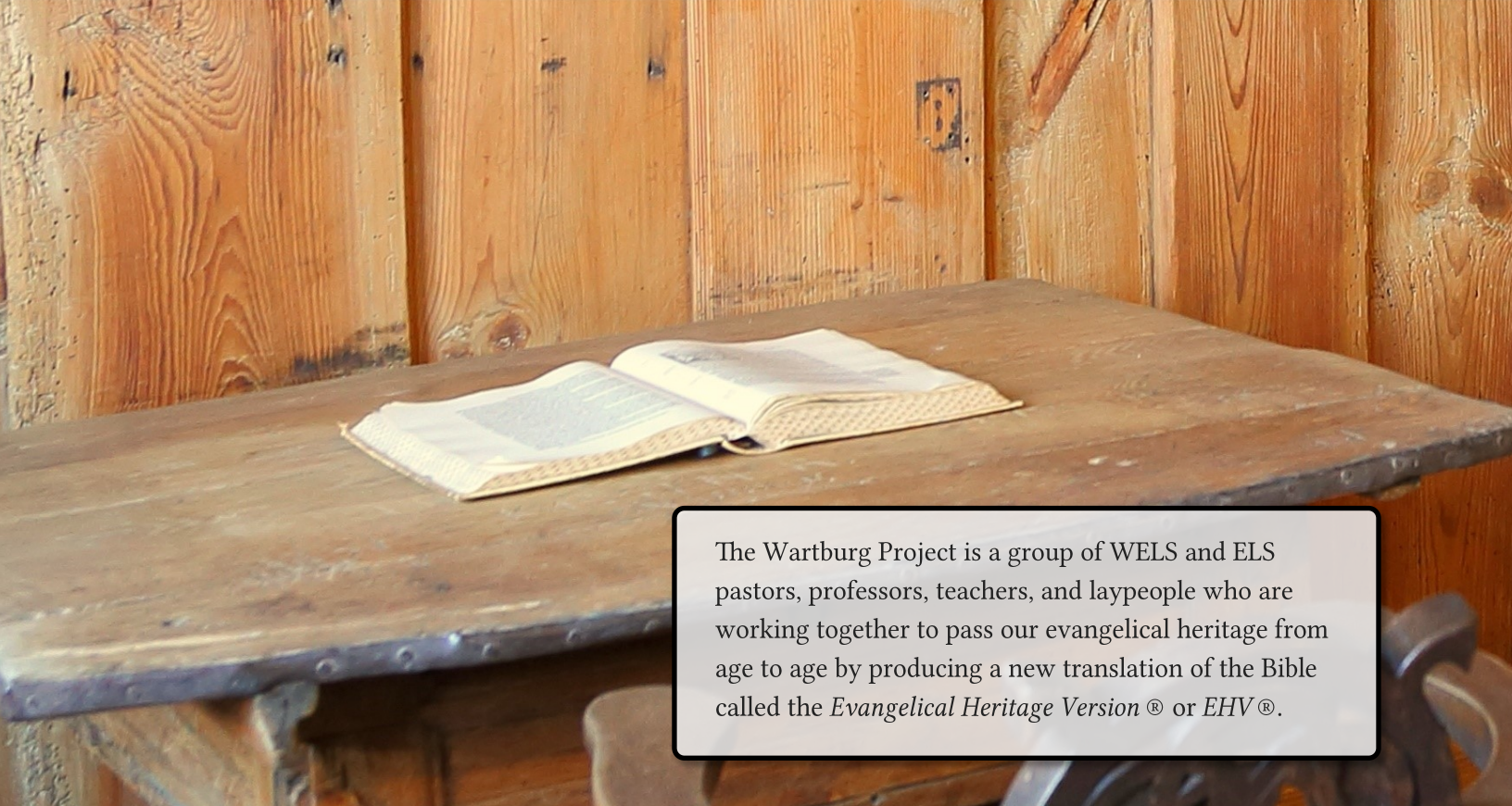

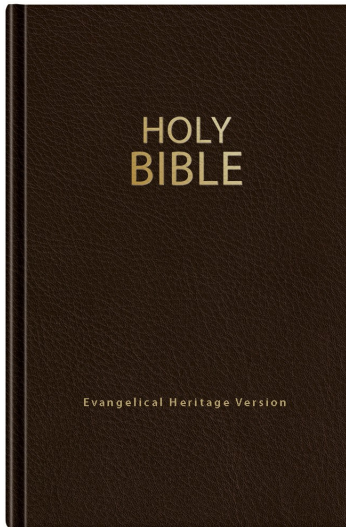
