Chromebook

We are still interested in receiving more information about school use of EHV on Chromebooks.

For school use, the EHV Study Bible from the Microsoft Store works well on Windows computers and devices. The biblical text and the study notes modules from Faith/Life Logos also work on Apple computers and Apple and Android phones. There are some compatibility and capacity issues that hinder use on Chromebooks for schools. It seems that the LOGOS version of the notes and text could be run on Chromebooks, or the notes could be used along side the EHV text posted on Bible Gateway (but they would not sync). Perhaps we could create an e-book of some sort or a pdf of the notes to be used on Chromebooks if there is sufficient demand. If you are currently using the Study Bible on Chromebook or have found some work-around to make it work well on Chromebook, please share the information with us. Or if you have any other suggestions for increasing Chromebook compatibility, please share that also.




